Just a few words on what is happening in the Borough. Our Planning Commission in conjunction with the Centre County Planning Office and Boggs Township, is working on a Joint Comprehensive Development Plan to replace our existing 1976 Plan.



With winter ending, the Borough employees will begin spring cleanup and continue with the ongoing street crack sealing program and storm water catch basin cleaning and repairs. There are no major street paving projects planned for this year. Minor jobs will be evaluated, and a plan developed to address them.

Election Year Results

Mayor - Brandon Schadle moved back to Milesburg Borough in the fall of 2016. Brandon had lived in Milesburg from 2006 - 2008. Brandon taught math at Bald Eagle Area, Mariana Bracetti Academy Charter School (Philadelphia), and now he has returned and is teaching math at Penns Valley High School. Brandon lives with his wife Meaghan and two young daughters.

Council Members:

- Peter DeLosa - He has been living in the Borough for 24 years and is the owner of Wizards Janitorial Systems and Rainbow International Restoration.
- Sandy Dieterle - She was reelected for her third term on the borough council. Borough Meetings are the 2nd Monday of every month at 6:30. All are welcome. If you cannot attend and have a praise or concern **you'd** like discussed at the meeting, simply contact a borough councilman, and he or she will present it at the meeting.

Borough Council Meeting Agenda (with the possibility of changes) will be posted on the website and at the community bulletin board by the Post Office prior to the meetings.

The Borough website is www.milesburgboro.com. It is updated frequently.

Borough projects continue on the streets, sidewalks, bridges, potholes and drains throughout the borough.
Route 150 and 144 are the responsibility of Penn Dot and therefore cannot be maintained by the Borough.

Park Rentals are available by calling the Borough Building. Renting guarantees you a pavilion, water and electricity.

Snow removal guidelines state that your car needs to be moved off the street if we have 4 or more inches or a snow emergency. Parking is available at the rear parking lot of the community center and the lot beside the Fire Company.

Public sidewalks are to be cleared no later than 24 hours after the snow stops.

Grass and leaves are not to be blown unto the streets as it clogs the storm drains.

Brush and leaf collection are on the last Monday of the month and other days are posted on the website.

Burning Ordinance – No burning of garbage, brush or leaves within the Borough. Only friendship fires are allowed.
